AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2015 General Fund Budget as a result of a \$13,000 grant from the Commonwealth of PA Department of Health, to the Health Department to expand services under the Safe and Healthy Communities Grant related to the prevention of heart attacks and strokes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2015 General Fund in the amount of \$13,000 reflecting receipt of monies from a PA Department of Health grant to provide additional services in the prevention of heart attacks and strokes.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund to the Health Department as follows:

SECTION FOUR: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

- **What Department or bureau is Bill originating from? Where did the initiative for the bill originate?**

The bill originated from the Department of Community Development, Bureau of Health. \$60,000 in new funds are being provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Division of Health Risk Reduction to expand services for a Safe and Healthy Communities grant.

- **Summary and Facts of the Bill**

Amending the 2015 General Fund Budget to provide for a new appropriation of Forty Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Five Dollar (\$40,425) from the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

The purpose of the funding is to increase access to breastfeeding friendly environments in worksites and to support the national Million Hearts initiative through planning and hosting a workshop to identify and discuss collaborative opportunities with local partners in preventing heart attacks and strokes.

The Bill will: 1) support healthier lifestyles by increasing breastfeeding rates through ensuring workplace compliance with the federal lactation accommodation law and; 2) reduce the burden of cardiovascular disease in the City of Allentown.

The bill is congruent with the Mayor's stated goal of improving the health and safety of the citizens of Allentown, particularly in the area of preventing chronic disease.

Total funding is \$60,000 of which \$19,575 will be utilized for currently budgeted staff wages while the remaining \$40,425 will fund new expenditures that will enhance the ability to prevent chronic disease in the community, through new programming designed to prevent heart attacks and strokes.

The bill allows us to increase grant revenue and cover additional expenses for the Nutrition & Physical Activity Program for prevention of chronic diseases. The award covers the Health Department burden on the general fund.
