INTRODUCED BY THE ADMINISTRATION

AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing PennDOT to execute for and on behalf of the City of Allentown pre-construction activities including preliminary engineering, environmental studies, final design, utility relocation and right-of-way acquisition services for the Commonwealth's performance of the Gordon Bridge Project.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

Whereas, the City of Allentown and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation, have coordinated through appropriate officials a bridge replacement project "Gordon Street Bridge".

WHEREAS, Reimbursement Agreement No. R15050014 for the bridge project will be executed for the project; and

WHEREAS, The Secretary of Transportation, acting for an on behalf of the Governor as well as himself, wishes to proceed in a prompt manner with pre-construction activities including preliminary engineering, environmental studies, final design, utility relocation and right-of-way acquisition for the bridge project.

NOW WHEREFORE, pursuant to Sections 2305 and 2307 of the General Local Government Code, 53 Pa.C.S. Sections 2305 and 2307, the City of Allentown hereby enacts this date the following Ordinance:

SECTION ONE. Delegation of Authority.

The City of Allentown hereby delegates to the Secretary of Transportation its authority to perform pre-construction activities including preliminary engineering, environmental studies, final design, utility relocation, and acquire right-of-way necessary for the bridge project described and enumerated in Reimbursement Agreement No. R15050014.

SECTION TWO. Duration.

This delegation shall continue until all Project terms and conditions of Reimbursement Agreement No. R15050014 shall be fully satisfied or, at the election of the parties as set forth therein, the same shall be otherwise terminated.

SECTION THREE. Purpose and Scope of Delegation.

The Secretary of Transportation shall have the authority to perform pre-construction activities including preliminary engineering, environmental studies, final design, utility relocation, and acquire right-of-way necessary for the Project described and enumerated in Reimbursement Agreement No. R15050014.

SECTION FOUR. Financing.

One hundred percent of right-of-way acquisition costs, along with all other pre-construction costs under the Reimbursement Agreement No. R15050014 is being funded with 5% local, 15% state, and 80% federal funding.

SECTION FIVE. Organizational Structure.

All pre-construction phases of the project shall be managed, directed and performed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation.

SECTION SIX. Property.

The Secretary of Transportation shall acquire property pursuant to all applicable policies and procedures as necessary for the Project as authorized by Section 2003(e) of the Administrative Code, 71 P.S. Section 513(e), for all transportation purposes which shall include, and not be limited to, acquisitions for local roads and streets.

SECTION SEVEN. That this Ordinance takes effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION EIGHT. That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

- **Summary and Facts of the Bill**

This Bill will provide authorization to PennDOT to work on the City's behalf to perform pre-construction activities including preliminary engineering, environmental studies, final design, utility relocation, and right-of-way acquisition services for the construction of a new Gordon Street Bridge. Authorizing PennDOT to perform the work will streamline all the processes necessary to bring the project to the construction contract bidding stage. The authorization will save overall project time, puts consultant contract selection for all pre-construction activities into PennDOT's hands, and bring the project to construction quicker. The City staff will have input into the design process and will oversee administrative and payment applications relative to the City's 5% contribution to the project.

The bill authorizes PennDOT to act on the City's behalf for the purpose of delivering the bridge project quicker and relieving the City of the need to enter into multiple contracts with consultants to perform the pre-construction work.

This bill is an authorization bill only. The bill references a Reimbursement Agreement for the project. The reimbursement agreement lays out the terms for Reimbursement to the City for project expenses at a rate of 80% federal and 15% state funding. City staff and the Solicitor's Office will review the Reimbursement Agreement prior to execution similar to the previously executed American Parkway, 15th & Ward Street bridges, and the Union Street Bridge projects.

Funds are to be reimbursed 80% from the federal government, 15% from state government, and 5% from the City of Allentown.

PennDOT has initiated early stages of the design process. It is anticipated that the pre-construction activities will be completed by 2017 and construction will commence in 2017.

The bill should be unanimously supported to facilitate a quicker process to improve the City's infrastructure to support economic development within the City of Allentown.
