AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2011 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of sixteen thousand six hundred seventy (\$16,670.00) dollars. This is a donation from Capital Blue Cross to the Police Department Anti-Crime program to provide for a surveillance camera at Hamilton and Jefferson Streets.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2011 General Fund in the amount of SIXTEEN THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED SEVENTY (\$16,670.00) DOLLARS reflecting receipt of monies from Capital Blue Cross to the Police Department Anti-Crime program to provide for a surveillance camera at Hamilton and Jefferson Streets.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund to the Police Department, Anti-Crime program as follows:


