AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2012 Capital Project Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of One Hundred Twenty-Three Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Four Dollars and Eighty-Seven Cents (\$123,364.87) from various closed-out Capital Projects to three Capital Projects which need additional funding.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the Capital Project Fund in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-Three Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Four Dollars and Eighty-Seven Cents (\$123,364.87) reflecting a transfer within the Capital Project Fund.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the Capital Project Fund in the following manner:

Department of Finance

- **Summary and Facts of the Bill**

This ordinance move remaining funds from capital projects are complete to projects which are in need of additional funding. It also moves funds within Capital Project 1235, City Hall Security Upgrades to the appropriate line item for the related expense.

- **Purpose – Please include the following in your explanation:**

There are several capital projects that are now completed that the total cost was less than originally anticipated. It is being requested that these remaining funds be transferred to capital projects that are in need of additional funds.

Police Department Records Management Systems, Police Department EMS Unit, Community Development City Hall Third and Fourth Renovations, and Community Development Incinerator Site projects will be closed with the transfer of these funds.

In 2008 City Council approved a transfer in the amount of \$25,000 from Capital Project 1753, American Parkway NE to Capital Project 1952, Industrial and Commercial Land Acquisition. The property that these funds were to be used for was not purchased and the funds never expended. This ordinance will return the \$25,000 back to Public Works and place it into Capital Project 1803, Bridge Repairs which is in need of additional funds.

The transfer of funds into Capital Project 1235, City Hall Security Upgrades will provide the additional \$723.14 needed to install the security system requested by City Council. \$2,367.86 already existed in this Capital Project and was no longer needed for any other security upgrade. Once the system is installed for City Council this Capital Project will be closed with no remaining balance.

When the Encrypted Police Radio Capital Account was created the EMS radios were forgotten. Transferring \$79,180.00 will provide the funding needed to purchase radios for the paramedics that enable them to communicate with the Police while on a crime scene. The safety of the Paramedics is at risk without the proper means of communication equipment.

The transfer of these funds will move money from projects which have ended to projects that are in need of additional funds so they can continue to progress.

The two funding sources are General Obligation Bonds from as far back as 1998 and the 2009 short term borrowing loan. Since this is money that was borrowed and not expended in the projects where it was originally appropriated, the funds need to be re-appropriated into other projects to be expended.

- **Priority status/Deadlines, if any**

The EMS radios need to be ordered by the end of April so they are received by the time the encrypted police radio system is deployed.

The security system for City Council can begin once the ordinance is approved as well as financial assistance for bridge repairs.

The three capital projects which will benefit from this passage of this ordinance all relate to the safety of City employees as well as the safety of the residents of the City.
