AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2012 Capital Project Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand One Hundred Seventy Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$250,170.30) from the Hamilton Street Reconstruction Capital Project and the City Hall Elevator Replacement Project to two Capital Projects which need additional funding.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the Capital Project Fund in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand One Hundred Seventy Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$250,170.30) reflecting a transfer within the Capital Project Fund.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the Capital Project Fund in the following manner:

There are several capital projects that are now completed that the total cost was less than originally anticipated. It is being requested that these remaining funds be transferred to capital projects that are in need of additional funds.

The Hamilton Street Reconstruction and the City Hall Elevator Replacement projects will be closed with the transfer of these funds.

The transfer of these funds will move money from projects which have ended to projects that are in need of additional funds so they can continue to progress.

The two funding sources are General Obligation Bonds from as far back as 2000. Since this is money that was borrowed and not expended in the projects where it was originally appropriated, the funds need to be re-appropriated into other projects to be expended.

With the ageing of City Hall as well as the Health Bureau portion of Alliance Hall different areas of the buildings are in need of repair. These repairs will improve the health and safety of our employees as well as the public using the buildings (i.e. mold remediation and floor replacement).

The three capital projects which will benefit from this passage of this ordinance all relate to the safety of City employees as well as the safety of the residents of the City.
