AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2011 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Thirty Three Thousand, Two Hundred Twenty Three Dollars and Seventy Five Cents (\$33,223.75) as a result of payments from the Lehigh Valley IronPigs Baseball Team to the City of Allentown Paramedics for provisioning of on-site Emergency Medical Services during baseball games and other events at Coca-Cola park for 2011 baseball season.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the General Fund in the amount of Thirty Three Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty Three Dollars and Seventy Five Cents (\$33,223.75) reflecting receipt of funds.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund in the following manner:

- What Department or bureau is Bill originating from? Where did the initiative for the bill originate?
Department of Emergency Medical Services

- Summary and Facts of the Bill

The City is in receipt of payment from Lehigh Valley IronPigs Baseball franchise for the purpose of covering our maximum costs associated with providing on-scene emergency medical services (EMS) staffing, normally two (2) paramedics, at every home game played, and at concert events and other events during the 2011 season.

- Purpose
 - What does the Bill do – what are the specific goals/tasks the bill seek to accomplish
 - What are the Benefits of doing this/Down-side of doing this
 - How does this Bill related to the City's Vision/Mission/Priorities

Allentown paramedics and the Lehigh Valley IronPigs have agreed to partner in a relationship whereby Allentown's paramedics will provide all EMS at events that occur in Coca-Cola park under the direction and control of the IronPigs. The fee to provide these services to the IronPigs is calculated to be the maximum expected cost to provide paramedic staff services without the intent of making a profit (zero-sum). The benefits of our presence at the park have already been seen by faster provisioning of needed emergency medical services. This relationship will occur monthly through the 2011 baseball season.

Payment to the City totaling \$33,233,75.

Provides for a diversion of work-scope to the paramedics and allows our service to remain visible.

Numerous citizens have been assisted by our immediately available paramedic services at the park; some of which have been life-saving. The visibility of City of Allentown paramedics at this large venue provides a show of pride and professionalism to the citizens and visitors of Allentown who attend these games and events. Our presence is good for the image of the City of Allentown and benefits the public by way of quick emergency response.
