



**November LANA Meeting Notes**

17 persons attended LANA's November 17 meeting at the Public Library. Our speaker, Rene Haines, Executive Director of the Allentown Public Library, told us the Allentown Library has 200,000 books and 7,000 DVD's and a circulation of 32,000 monthly. There are 81 computer screens and wireless printing. The Library now shares its catalogue with other libraries so you can speedily order a book from one for \$.50.

Besides free concerts, programs include a story time in English or Spanish, (and maybe other languages) and a summer reading club. Last summer's theme of Star Wars was visited by reenactors. "Heros" is next summer's theme.

Plans are being made for a native plant garden on the Jefferson St side.

**Police report:**

Captain Struss reported 7 part-one crimes in the past month, including one burglary (but only a furnace part was stolen), one aggravated assault resulting in a domestic arrest; 2 auto accessory thefts (tire and rim, a continuing problem throughout the Lehigh Valley), 2 theft from buildings and one from an unlocked car.

Captain Struss advised to lock car and garage doors, and cover items in the car. 46% of auto thefts stem from keys being left in the car. Always pay attention to your surroundings.

The Police station at 10<sup>th</sup> and Hamilton St accepts old medication 24/7.

Allentown Police have initiated a Combat Auto Theft Program. If you do not drive late at night you can get a CAT sticker for the car; if Police see your car being driven late at night, they will stop it.

Also Project Lifesaver will offer location bracelets for persons with Alzheimers or Autism who may be prone to wandering.
