Crime Watch: Attempted Break-In

A resident of the 1200 block Union St reported an attempted break-in on Thursday January 3, around 2 p.m.

She heard glass breaking behind her house and when she went outside out discovered a young man by the neighbor's rear door. She asked what he was doing and he said he was there to repair the door but gave the wrong address.

She told him the address was wrong and he apologized, saying he would have to call his boss to pay for it. He said he would have to go back to his truck to find a card. The resident went into her house to get her neighbor's phone number. When she came out a few minutes later, he was not there.

She called Police. Talking to the neighbor later, they discovered that not only was a window broken, but the door had been jimmed and an attempt had been made to pick the lock.

The person is described as a male, light-skinned Latino, age 25-28, 6 feet tall, about 225 pounds, wearing jeans and a sweatshirt (no markings).

If you see or hear suspicious activity call the Police at 911 immediately.
