December Meeting Highlights

Gretchen Krasley ran the meeting. PSA 2 Captain Gail Struss was in attendance. She reported about continued daytime burglaries. She advised us to lock doors at all times, set alarms if we have them, and lock cars after taking valuable items such as laptops and phones with us. Another tip is to secure windows with air conditioners, another entry point for thieves. If you can invest in a light with a motion sensor, it is an added deterrent to crime. We are all reminded not to hesitate to call the non-emergency number (610 437-7751) to report any suspicious activity. Captain Struss reminded us about the C.A.T. (Combat Auto Theft) program which provides auto owners who don't drive between midnight and 8 a.m. with an ID sticker for their car to alert police who observe their car during those hours that it might be stolen. Call 610-437-7721 for more details. We were also reminded about Project Lifesaver, a program which is designed to require people who wander from their homes to wear a tracking bracelet. For more information, call 610-437-7713. Neighbors are still invited to use the Medical Return Box in the lobby of the police station at 10th and Hamilton Streets. Remove prescription labels or blacken your name before depositing in the bin. The lobby is open 24/7. Captain Struss distributed copies of Tip 411, a list of questions that police and non-emergency personnel might ask you when you call in a crime or suspicious activity. (Emergency - 911; Non-emergency-610 437-7751; Text tip 847411). Knowing in advance what you'll be asked can help you provide the most complete information. Why Is It Called Student Overlay District?

It is called an Overlay District because it imposes new regulations on top of the existing Residential Zone regulations. The purpose of the Overlay District is to “protect the single family owner occupied residential character of the immediate neighborhood surrounding an institution of higher learning, while permitting the residence of students ‘off-campus’ proximate to the institution. It is the intent of the district to protect the character of the area, and diminish those influences which infringe on the quiet enjoyment of single family owner occupied residences such as noise, litter, overcrowding, additional parking needs, and lack of maintenance of the structures and their grounds.”
