Breaking into teams we cleaned on Linden from 12th to 14th, Hamilton; Maple; Walnut, 12th to Franklin including the many alleys down as far as Fairview. We covered quite a bit of territory.

All told we collected 16 bags of trash, plus 6 bags of recycling, which the City recycling crew were quick and efficient in picking all of it up.

Afterwards the Keenan House friends and many of us enjoyed a pleasant luncheon at Lehigh Valley Presbyterian Church - pizza and subs from Antonio's at 13th & Hamilton, salads, wonderful deviled eggs (Marilyn's special recipe with farm fresh eggs), and nice desserts. We sent our Keenan House friends home with a few extra pies that they will enjoy for a while.

Someone asked if the Keenan House residents, who are undergoing an intensive drug treatment program are forced to take part. They replied that the day the notice for the clean-up was listed at Keenan House, it was immediately filled, and all nine came. I was glad for our opportunity to share with them.

On Sunday a week later Faith Evangelical came out to clean the parks along MLK Jr Drive.

I was glad to work with them again. The members of the Church did this last year, and came a second time. They took many bags of stuff out of the WPA keyhole and the 10th St steps, from above the wall on Union St Hill.

I counted 30 or more tires, 18 bags and a mound of trash, a few old TV sets, a mattress and box springs and more. There is no way our neighborhood could have done this. It was heavy work! The City Parks crew did a very nice job of picking up the trash but had to come back to Willow St Monday morning so residents could get their cars out.
